4th – 8th March, 2019

OVERVIEW

This course provides radiographers with a deeper understanding and knowledge of English and helps improve technical vocabulary related to their field. Our principal goal is to assist radiographers to communicate effectively and accurately through English in their working lives.

TARGET

The course is aimed at radiographers who deal with English speaking patients or those who require English to communicate with international colleagues at meetings or conferences.

PRINCIPAL COURSE CONTENT

- Medical and radiographic terminology
- Patient communication
- Public speaking, presentation skills and preparing for conference presentation
- Interactive workshops using medical equipment

OBJECTIVES

Develop your capacity to:

- use English with confidence in the workplace
- hold informal conversations with international colleagues
- give presentations and attend conferences
- use technical vocabulary specific to your field

APPROACH

This intensive course is highly interactive. You will develop these language areas through small group activities, role play, simulation and by using medical equipment specific to your sector. Classes are student focused and will have a maximum of 15 students per group.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation can also be arranged with a host family. The cost includes breakfast and one evening meal. This is highly recommended and is the best way to fully immerse yourself in the language.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The cost includes approximately 6 hours of lessons, interactive lessons/workshops with medical equipment each day along with a further 2 hours per day of conversation.

 10 hours conversation

Professional English Language Course for Radiographers

Course content themes:

1. *Technical language for Radiographers;*
2. *Communication with patients in English;*
3. *Preparing for conference presentations.*

Technical language for Radiographers:

Dedicated sessions will be provided which will cover the key terminology used in general radiography, computed tomography (CT), magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) and interventional radiology (IR). There will also be a radiographic image viewing sessions focussing on image critique, radiographic anatomy and pathology. A published peer-reviewed journal article will be reviewed in order to familiarise participants with the language used. A glossary of key terminology used will be provided for all participants along with associated activities. Finally a short translating test on key terminology will take place towards the end of the programme.

Communication with patients in English:

Practical role-play scenarios will be conducted in the clinical skills laboratories at University College Dublin where participants will interact and discuss standard questions that would be directed at patients, terminology related to the associated imaging techniques and how best to explain this to patients, and terminology related to patient monitoring equipment.

Preparing for conference presentations:

This will start with the first stage of presenting at a scientific conference i.e. submission of an abstract. A scientific abstract will reviewed and discussed in small groups and a presentation delivered on this topic followed by questions and answers. Presentation skills will be covered throughout the course through sessions exploring presentation structure, useful phrases, and linking sections. Sample videos of good and bad scientific presentations will be reviewed in class. Participants will be required to give an informal presentation initial followed by a short, formal scientific presentation at the end of the course.

Other course features:

- Sessions will be delivered by a number of expert Radiography teachers;
- A clinical visit highlighting roles and responsibilities in Ireland followed by tour of the clinical department will be included;
- A tour of the Diagnostic Imaging facilities in University College Dublin will be included;
- Accommodation will be provided for one week with a local family thus guaranteeing a true Irish experience and good immersion in English;
- There will be a maximum of 15 students per course;
- Certificate of completion will be presented to all participants at the end of the course;
- An evening event will be arranged for all participants during the course.
